

WHAT IS MPH COURSE (MASTERS OF PUBLIC HEALTH)?

A <u>Masters of Public Health</u> (MPH) degree is a professional graduate degree that focuses on the science and art of promoting and protecting the health of communities and populations. Biostatistics: Biostatistics is the application of statistical methods to biological and medical data. MPH graduates should be able to apply statistical methods to public health data and use statistical software to analyze data.

Epidemiology: Epidemiology is the study of the distribution and determinants of health and disease in populations. MPH graduates should be able to design and implement epidemiological studies and analyze and interpret epidemiological data.

Health Policy: Health policy is the study of the policies and procedures that govern the provision of healthcare services. MPH graduates should be able to analyze and evaluate health policies and advocate for policy changes that improve public health.

Environmental Health: Environmental health is the study of how environmental factors affect human health. MPH graduates should be able to identify and mitigate environmental health risks and promote environmental health policies.

Health Promotion: Health promotion is the process of enabling people to increase control over their



<u>health and improve their health behaviors.</u> MPH graduates should be able to design and implement health promotion programs and interventions that promote healthy behaviors.

In addition to these core competencies, MPH programs aim to develop a range of other skills in students, including:

Communication Skills: MPH graduates should be able to communicate effectively with diverse audiences, including policymakers, healthcare providers, and community members.

Leadership Skills: MPH graduates should be able to lead teams and manage public health programs and initiatives.

Critical Thinking and Problem-Solving Skills: MPH graduates should be able to analyze complex public health problems and develop evidence-based solutions.

Cultural Competency: MPH graduates should be able to work effectively with individuals from diverse cultural backgrounds and understand the impact of cultural factors on health behaviors and outcomes.
